If this occurs this year, she is trying to organize a large group of volunteers to help save the fish. I do not know more at this time but I will have more information in the coming days. 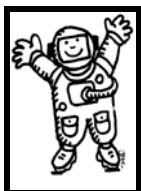
4 June 2005: 11:52 a.m. PDT:

The temperature of the Truckee River at this station is currently 48 degrees Fahrenheit (8.888 degrees Celsius). Flows are Springtime runoff at 382 cfs, water is fairly clear with some sedimentation suspended, a bit foggy for fish...hope they don't need goggles.

The outside temperature is 64 degrees Fahrenheit (17.777 degrees Celsius) with a brisk wind from the northeast and few, very few, clouds.

It's Truckee Day! when all the citizens of the Town go around and pick up all the accumulated garbage on town streets from the rapidly retreating Winter. Orange bags line all the streets and the dogs are bummed out: no more snacks on the side of the road left over from all those Wintertime Feasts. But fish eat worms and I bet worms have all of those same characteristics. And what about helgramites? Helgramites have moms.

And how low can humans go, catching fish with salmon eggs? If fish are so smart why do they bite on fluorescent marshmallows, stinky Power Bait and shiny spinners? And fish eggs.

Kamchatka is a peninsula the size of California that lies on the Siberian coast west of Alaska. ## Martis Lake: Possible Fish Stranding

An important message from the Park Ranger at Martis Lake:

Hello all - I am attempting to organize a large group of volunteers in anticipation of a possible fish stranding situation here at Martis.

The water levels this year have been very high; 12-14 feet above our usual minimum pool of elev. 5872! The lake is now receding and eventually there may be ponds left with no outlet back to the lake. Several years ago this occurred and a great group of volunteers responded to save hundreds of fish stranded in these ponds.

I am giving this wide distribution to get as many commitments as possible, so please pass this on to anyone who would be interested in helping the fish when the time comes.

As of this moment, I cannot say when the stranding may occur, possibly in a month or so, maybe sooner. I would like to get commitments ASAP so I can get a group together that will be ready to respond within a day of notification. I will try to make it on a weekend if possible, if not, perhaps we could do it later in the day if there are work conflicts for some folks.

So please RSVP and let me know if you might be able to respond when the time comes. Martis Creek Lake harbors the endangered Lahontan Cutthroat Trout and it would be unfortunate to lose any of these fish to a stranding situation.

Thanks for being friends of Martis and I hope to hear from many of you soon! I will let you know if the lake goes down without stranding any fish, maybe if we're lucky.
